



ANNOUNCEMENT OF BILINGUAL ASSESSMENT MATERIALS GRANTS

The Woodcock-Muñoz Foundation is sponsoring a number of bilingual assessment instructional materials grants to school, clinical, and counseling psychology programs.¹ The purpose of the grants is to support the training of psychologists and other assessment professionals specializing in bilingual assessment. Additionally, the grants are intended to encourage the development of contemporary training models in bilingual cognitive abilities and achievement assessment.

The Woodcock-Muñoz Foundation will purchase and provide each awarded program with 1 to 12 copies of the complete Bateria III, based on documentation of need² and proposed use³. The complete Bateria III includes the Bateria III Woodcock-Muñoz Pruebas de habilidades cognitiva (Bateria III Tests of Cognitive Abilities) the Bateria III Woodcock-Muñoz: Pruebas de aprovechamiento (Bateria III Tests of Achievement). The diagnostic supplement to the Bateria III Tests of Cognitive Abilities (Suplemento diagnóstico para las pruebas de habilidades cognitivas) and Compuscore are also included.

To apply for a grant, a university training program must submit a letter of intent and a proposed course syllabus. The letter of intent should describe your training program, your proposed approach to training bilingual assessment specialists, and the approximate number of bilingual assessment specialists trained annually. The proposed course syllabus must demonstrate that you will make substantial use of the awarded materials and contain the name and email address of the instructor.

The only stipulation in receiving a grant is that the Woodcock-Muñoz Foundation may publicly announce that a grant has been made to your program.

¹ State department of education approved professional certification programs for Educational Diagnosticians and Speech and Language Clinicians are also eligible to apply.

² Need is established by providing an estimate of the number of students per year whom you intend to prepare to specialize in bilingual assessment.

³ Proposed use is evaluated via the letter of intent and proposed course syllabus.
