



Neuropsychological Assessment Course Grant Program Announcement

The Woodcock-Muñoz Foundation is sponsoring a new materials grant program to applied psychology training programs in neuropsychological assessment. The purpose of the grants is to encourage the development of model courses in neuropsychological assessment using the *Dean-Woodcock Neuropsychological Assessment System* (D-WNAS) for training purposes. The D-WNAS utilizes the *Woodcock-Johnson III* (WJ III), the *Dean-Woodcock Sensory-Motor Battery* (D-WSMB), the *Dean-Woodcock Structured Interview* (D-WSI) and *Dean-Woodcock Emotional Status Exam* (D-WESE) as parts of an interpretive system in which both neurological and psychological data are integrated into a comprehensive view of an individual's cognitive, academic, sensory, motor, and emotional functioning.

To apply for a grant, a psychology training program must have an identified course in neuropsychological assessment. A letter of intent and proposed course syllabus must be submitted.
